<p>1. If a child has Covid like symptoms.</p>	<p>Call parents to get the child tested. The child will need to stay away until the child is symptom free and has a negative test.</p>	<p>Take the child to get a covid test and keep the child home till the child gets a negative test result.</p>
<p>2. If the educator has Covid like symptoms.</p>	<p>The educator will go get a Covid test and will not look after children till, they get a negative test result.</p>	
<p>3. If the educator tests positive</p>	<p>The educator will inform their co-ordinator of this development. And follow their guidelines.</p> <p>The educator will go into isolation for 10 days from the day of test. The day of the test will be considered day 0. They will also need to get a test done on day 3 and day 8.</p> <p>They will be able to come out of isolation on day 11 if they get a negative test and are symptom free for 72 hours.</p> <p>Educators' family members will be considered household contact and go into a 10-day isolation as well. They will need a negative 8-day result and be symptom free for 72 hrs before they can come out isolation.</p>	<p>Children in care will be considered close contact and will need to go into isolation for 7 days going for a test on day 5. They can come out of isolation on day 8 if they get a negative test result. They are to monitor their symptoms and go for a test if they develop covid like symptoms.</p> <p>The children's family members are not considered and can continue going to work and school as usual. They are to monitor their symptoms.</p>
<p>4. A child (X) in care tests positive</p>	<p>The educator will inform their co-ordinator of this development. And follow their guidelines.</p> <p>The educator and other children in care will be considered close contact and will need to go into isolation for 7 days, going for a test on day 5. They can come out of isolation on day 8 if they</p>	<p>The child (x) who tested positive will go into isolation for 10 days from the day of test. The day of the test will be considered day 0. They will also need to get a test done on day 3 and day 8.</p>

	<p>get a negative test result. They are to monitor their symptoms and go for a test if they develop covid like symptoms.</p> <p>The educator and the other children in care's family members are not considered and can continue going to work and school as usual. They are to monitor their symptoms.</p>	<p>They will be able to come out of isolation on day 11 if they get a negative test and are symptom free for 72 hours.</p> <p>X's family members will be considered household contact and go into a 10-day isolation as well. They will need a negative 8-day result and be symptom free for 72 hrs before they can come out isolation.</p>
<p>5. Parents or family members of a child tests positive</p>	<p>The educator will ask the parents to get the child tested and will keep in touch with the parents to see how the child is doing.</p> <p>The educator and the other children in care are not considered close contact. Educators will continue care as usual and will monitor their symptoms.</p> <p>If the child's results come back positive, then the educator becomes a close contact along with the other care children. (Refer to situation 4)</p>	<p>The child will be considered household contact and go into a 10-day isolation as well. They will need a negative 8-day result and be symptom free for 72 hrs before they can come out isolation.</p> <p>Parents are to monitor their symptoms and go for a test if they develop covid like symptoms.</p> <p>If the child's results come back positive, then the parents will inform the educator.</p>
<p>6. Educator is a close contact</p>	<p>The educator will inform their co-ordinator of this development. And follow their guidelines.</p> <p>The educator needs to go into isolation for 7 days. Day 0 will be the day of last contact. If the educator finds out 4 days after they last had contact with a positive case, it would be considered day 4 of isolation and they would go for a test on day 5.</p> <p>They can come out of isolation on day 8 if they get a negative test result. They are to monitor their symptoms and go for a test if they develop covid like symptoms.</p> <p>The educator's family members are not considered and can continue going to work and</p>	<p>The children in care are not considered close contact. They do not need to go into isolation; however, they do need to monitor the child's symptoms.</p> <p>Parents and other members of the household can continue going to work and school as usual. They are to monitor their symptoms.</p>

	<p>school as usual. They are to monitor their symptoms.</p> <p>If the Educator's results come back positive, then the children in care and the educator's family members become a close contact (Refer to situation 3)</p>	
7. Parents or family members of a child are close contact	<p>The child can come to care, they are not considered close contact.</p> <p>The educator and the children in care are not considered close contact. Educators will continue care as usual and will monitor their symptoms.</p>	<p>The child can continue to go to care unless someone in the household tests positive.</p> <p>Parents and other members of the household can continue going to work and school as usual. They are to monitor their symptoms.</p>
8. Educator's family member is a close contact.	<p>Although the educator is not considered a close contact, the educator's household is not allowed visitors.</p> <p>In this case, the educator can not continue care until the family member completes their isolation period.</p>	<p>Parents will keep their child away until the isolation period is over.</p>
9. Child is a close contact	<p>The educator and the children in care are not considered close contact. Educators will continue care as usual and will monitor their symptoms.</p>	<p>The child needs to go into isolation for 7 days. Day 0 will be the day of last contact. If the parents find out that their child was in contact with a positive case 2 days ago then it would be considered day 2 of isolation and they would go for a test on day 5.</p> <p>The child can come out of isolation on day 8 if they get a negative test result. Parents are to monitor their child's symptoms and go for a test if they develop covid like symptoms.</p> <p>The children's family members are not considered and can continue going to work and school as usual. They are to monitor their symptoms.</p>
